



Call for applications for the position of Chair, WA Livestock Research Council (WALRC)

The WA Livestock Research Council (WALRC) is calling for EOIs from persons interested in the role of chair to replace retiring chairman Dr Tim Watts. The position will commence July 2022, however a hand-over period (March-June) is anticipated.

The WALRC chair will lead a motivated and connected Council with the primary task of informing MLA of the red meat research and extension priorities that are specific to the WA agricultural and rangelands region; and reviewing RD&A research proposals that are submitted against the identified priorities.

The WALRC chair plays a critical role in working with the WA research and extension community to optimise the levy spend in a way that provides relevant and timely research and extension to the sector.

The WALRC chair is supported by a professional executive officer and a six-person committee of management.

The term is negotiable but expected to be for two years in the first instance with the opportunity to extend.
