The WA Livestock Research Council is calling for students to apply for a \$2500 WALRC scholarship to cover operating expenses associated with their research project.

We will prioritise our scholarship funds to students with well-constructed applications that address one of our top-rating producer extension priorities:

- Strategies to improve climate resilience in livestock systems.
- Sheep and/or Cattle Reproduction.
- Application of commercially available technologies to address production and management efficiencies.
- Grazing Management.
- Emerging risks to sheep and cattle health and welfare.

The Application process is simple

Just write to us here at WALRC (2 pages maximum) outlining the rationale for your study and how the findings may lead to an improved understanding and management of any of the five issues listed above in southern WA farming and/or rangelands systems.

The recipient/s of a WALRC scholarship will be expected to introduce their project at our Winter Livestock Matters Forum in June and then formally present to Council at the conclusion of the study, in December. Recipient/s will also be encouraged to attend various industry events throughout the year convened by WALRC and will be paired by a producer mentor from WALRC for the duration of their scholarship.
